It follows then as certain as that night succeeds the day, that without a decisive naval force we can do nothing definitive, and with it, everything honorable and glorious."



## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The Nomination Committee has submitted the below recommendations for appointment/reappointment to the Board of Directors. Terms will expire on December 31, 2023.

**Dave Grundies** – Dave is a native of Newark, Ohio and graduated from Wake Forest University and was commissioned an Ensign in the U.S. Navy. As a Naval Aviator, he piloted aircraft on and off aircraft carriers and Naval Air Stations around the world. He was the Commanding Officer of Fleet Logistics Squadron Three Zero.

In the private sector, Dave built business partnerships in the San Diego defense community, is active in many community and business organizations. Dave is a two-term Past President of the San Diego Council of the Navy League and remains a continued supporter of the council.

**Ed Naranjo** - Ed entered the U.S. Navy in San Diego, California and graduated from recruit training in May 1983. Ed served aboard numerous ships and in April 1993, he reported onboard the staff of Commander, Naval Surface Force, U.S. Pacific Fleet, where he was selected as Staff Sailor of the Year, promoted to Chief Petty Officer and Commissioned as a Naval Officer through the Limited Duty Officer Program. As a commissioned officer he has served many staff billets and Commanding Officer billets. Since his retirement Ed has been active in many community organizations.

**Phyllis Barber** – Phyllis is originally from Vermont, when she enlisted in the United States Navy and retired after almost 23 years of service. After retiring Phyllis became a member of many community organization such as the Downtown Lions Club, Armed Services YMCA and the San Diego Council of the Navy League where she served in many positions. She became the first woman president of the Council, has served as a Vice President and currently as 1st Vice President.







# ON THIS DATE IN...

## **OCTOBER**

**Oct 1, 1880** – John Phillip Sousa becomes leader of the Marine Corps band.

**Oct 1, 1955 –** Commissioning of USS *Forrestal* (CVA-59, the first of postwar supercarriers.

**Oct 1, 1997** – The first African-American female colonel in the Marine Corps was promoted to the rank at MCAS Cherry Point, NC.

**Oct 5, 1938 –** The first members were enrolled in the Coast Guard Reserve.

**Oct 6, 1884** – Department of the Navy establishes the Naval War College at Newport, RI.

**Oct 6, 1990** – NASA astronaut and Coast Guard CDR Bruce Melnick made his first space flight.

**Oct 7, 1975** – President Gerald Fords signs law allowing admission of women into service academies.

**Oct 7, 2001** – Operation Enduring Freedom begins with carrier air strikes, and ship and submarine Tomahawk strikes.

**Oct 9, 1942** – First three schools for enlisted WAVES open at Stillwater, OK.

**Oct 10, 1845** – Naval School, later the Naval Academy, opens in Annapolis, MD with 50 midshipmen and seven faculty.

Oct 12 - COLUMBUS DAY!!!

**Oct 12, 1965** – First group of men commissioned into the Navy Nurse Corps report for one month indoctrination to Naval service.

**Oct 12, 2000** – Terrorists in a boat make a suicide attack on USS *Cole* (DDG-67) while the ship refuels in the port of Aden, Yemen. Seventeen sailors are killed.

#### Oct 13 - HAPPY 245th BIRTHDAY UNITED STATES NAVY!!!

**Oct 13, 1988** – The first U.S. merchant marine World War II veterans received their Coast Guard issued discharge certificates. Congress gave the merchant mariners veterans' status and tasked the Coast Guard with administering the discharges.

**Oct 16, 1943** – Navy accepts it first helicopter at Bridgeport, CT.

**Oct 17, 1989** – Coast Guard units assisted state and local agencies in rescue and relief operations after a 7.1 earthquake hit Northern California.

**Oct 19, 1915** – Establishment of Submarine Base at New London, CT.

**Oct 22**, **1962** – President John F. Kennedy orders surface blockade of Cuba to prevent Soviet offensive weapons from reaching Cuba during the Cuban Missile Crisis.

**Oct 23, 1983 –** A suicide truck bomber attacks the Marine barracks at Beirut airport, Lebanon killing 241 service members (220 Marines, 18 Sailors, and 3 Soldiers).

Oct 25, 1983 – U.S. Marines and U.S. Army troops land on Grenada to evacuate U.S. citizens.

**Oct 26, 1922** – LCDR Godfrey deC. Chevalier makes landing aboard USS *Langley* while underway of Cape Henry, VA.

**Oct 27, 1943** – First women Marines report for duty at Camp Pendleton.

**Oct 30, 1799 –** William Balch becomes the Navy's first commissioned Chaplain.
