Due to health concerns and in keeping with the mandates of local and national officials, our breakfast meetings are cancelled until further notice.



YEAR IN REIVEW 2020









ON THIS DATE IN...

DECEMBER

Dec 1, 1947 – The Marine Corps' first helicopter squadron HMX-1 was commissioned at Quantico, VA.

Dec 2, 1965 – USS *Enterprise* (CVAN-65) and USS *Banbridge* (DLGN-25) become the first nuclear-powered task unit used in combat operations with the launch of air strikes near Bien Hoa, Vietnam.

Dec 7, 1941 – The Imperial Japanese Navy launched a surprise aerial attack on Pearl Harbor and surrounding Army Air Force airfields in Hawaii. "A day that will live in infamy..."

Dec 7, 1988 - The Coast Guard hosted an international summit between Soviet President Mikhail Gorbachev, President Ronald Reagan, and President-elect and then-Vice President George H. W. Bush on Governors Island.

Dec 8, 1933 – Secretary of the Navy establishes Fleet Marine Force, integrating a ready-to-deploy a Marine force with their own aircraft into Fleet organization.

Dec 8, 1992 – Marines participated in Operation Restore Hope, Mogadishu, Somalia.

Dec 10 - Hanukkah begins at sunset!!!

Dec 10, 1941 – A PBY piloted by LT. Utter of VP-101 shoots down Japanese ZERO in the first Navy air-to-air kill during World War II.

Dec 10, 1979 – The first Poseidon submarine configured with Trident missiles, USS *Francis Scott Key* (SSBN-657), completes initial deterrent patrol.

Dec 11, 1954 – First supercarrier of 59,630 tons, USS *Forrestal* (CVA-59), launched at Newport News, VA.

Dec 15, 1948 – The Secretary of the Navy signed a "Memorandum of Agreement" with the State Department which laid the basis for the modern Marine Security Guard program at U.S. embassies throughout the world.

Dec 17, 1942 – The Navy credited the CGC Ingham with attacking and sinking the submerged U-boat U-626 south of Greenland.

Dec 18, 1965 – River Patrol Force is established in Vietnam.

Dec 20, 1989 – Operation Just Cause was launched in Panama to protect American lives, restore the democratic process, preserve the integrity of the Panama Canal Treaty, and apprehend dictator General Manuel Antonio Noriega.

Dec 21 - The first day of Winter!!!

Dec 21, 1861 – Congress authorizes the Medal of Honor, the Nation's highest military award, for Naval personnel.

Dec 22, 1942 – Sue Dauser takes oath of office as Superintendent of Navy Nurse Corps, becoming the first woman with the relative rank of Captain in the U.S. Navy.

Dec 25 - MERRY CHRISTMAS!!!

Dec 26, 2004 – The CGC Munro, deployed as part of Expeditionary Strike Group 5 to assist after a massive tsunami and tremors struck Indonesia and southern Thailand.

Dec 31, 2020 - New Year's Eve!!! Goodbye 2020!!!

Sea Cadets Doing Construction

The USNSCC offers cadets unique experiences both with and without military affiliations. The last 2 months, cadets from Challenger Division/Training Ship Columbia have been building an observation dock at our drill site, Chet F. Harritt Elementary School. Last month, the cadets with a very rough sketch, brought the drawing to life. They flattened out the area where the dock would be built. They then used geometry to frame the desired area. Cadets played "Tetris" with chunks of rock to fill in the shape.

This month, the cadets completed Phase II of the science observation dock creationfilling it in with concrete. Though we cannot do any "group PT", the cadets definitely got their exercise. The cadets used thirty, 90-Ib bags of Quickrete. The cadets, ranging in age from 10 -17, learned how to balance a wheelbarrow as they transported the bags from the truck to the work area. The Chief offered some instruction on how to properly and efficiently open the concrete bags, add water and mix the concrete. The cadets worked all day to fill in the dock. They took turns mixing the Quikrete with water and spreading the mixture into the form. They planned for drainage, so the dock would not breed mosquitos or have puddles for the students to have to stand in. The cadets worked as a team to get the job done.

They took great pride in their finished product. Even more gratifying is the notion that their hard work will benefit the students at the school. The students will be able to use the dock to conduct science experiments year-round. The cadets worked extremely hard and I'm sure they slept well that night.
