

ON THIS DATE IN...

JULY

July 1, 1850 - Naval School at Annapolis renamed Naval Academy.

July 1, 1914 – Prohibition of alcohol begins in the Navy.

July 3, 2002 – The first of the Coast Guard's Maritime Safety and Security Teams (MSST's) was commissioned in Seattle, WA.

July 4 - American colonies declare their independence from Great Britain.

HAPPY 245th BIRTHDAY AMERICA!!!

July 6, 1911 - The first naval aviation base is established at Annapolis, MD.

July 6, 1976 - The 1st women enter the Naval Academy.

July 7, 1948 – The first six enlisted women are sworn into the Regular Navy.

July 11, 1941 – Congress reconfirmed the military status of the Coast Guard, stating: "The Coast Guard shall be a military service and constitute a branch of the land and naval forces of the United States at all times and shall operate under the Treasury Department in time of peace and operate as part of the Navy, in time of war or when the President shall so direct."

July 12, 1862 - The Medal of Honor is created.

July 12, 1916 – USS *North Carolina* is the first Navy ship to carry and operate aircraft.

July 12, 1990 - Commander Rosemary B. Mariner becomes the first woman to command an operational aviation squadron (VAQ-34).

July 14, 1813 – Lt. John M. Gamble, is the first marine to command a ship in battle.

July 14, 1952 – Laying of keel of USS *Forrestal*, the first 59.900-ton aircraft carrier.

July 20, 1964 – Four Navy divers enter Project SEALAB I capsule moored 192 feet on the ocean floor off Bermuda for an 11-day experiment.

July 26, 1947 – The National Security Act of 1947 became effective, reaffirming the status of the Marine Corps as a separate military service within the Department of the Navy.

July 28, 1918 – BGen John A. Lejeune assumed command of the 2d Division, U.S. Army in France, and remained in that capacity until August 1919 when the unit was demobilized.

July 29, 1969 – Former Navy pilot Neil Armstrong is the first man to set foot on the moon. While taking the first step, he said, "That's one small step for man, one giant leap for mankind."

July 23, 1993 – Sarah Deal becomes the first woman Marine selected for naval aviation training.

July 26, 1948 - President Harry S. Truman orders desegregation of the Armed Services.
