HAPPY 59th BIRTHDAY UNITED STATES SEA CADET CORPS

The Sea Cadets was established by the Navy League of the United States at the request of the Department of the Navy in 1962 to "create a favorable image of the Navy on the part of American youth". The mission of the Sea Cadets is to build leaders of character.



Today the Sea Cadets continue to further the image of our maritime services by:

- *Developing an interest and ability in seamanship and seagoing skills *Instilling virtues of good citizenship and strong moral principles in each cadet
- *Demonstrating the value of an alcohol-free, drug-free and gangfree lifestyle

Exposing cadets to the prestige of public service and a variety of career paths through hands-on training with our nation's armed services. The mission of the Sea Cadets is to build leaders of character by imbuing in our cadets the highest ideals of honor, respect, commitment, and service.

There are 380 plus total units in 47 states, Guam and Puerto Rico with 9,000 plus ages 10-18 annually serving. 3000 plus volunteers spending over 278,000 hours volunteering each year. Our volunteers hail from diverse backgrounds. Many of our volunteers are active duty, reserve, or retired servicemembers.

In a typical year 1,000 cadets finish high school and graduate from the USNSCC. These remarkable young men and women often choose to serve in the military, attend universities and trade schools, or serve their local communities through frontline careers.

Leadership opportunities and learning valuable skills open a wide variety of career paths for our cadets. Examples include public service, medicine, and law enforcement. Many pursue higher education. While there is no requirement for military service,

many cadets join the armed forces.

A recent poll showed that 65% of cadets were interested in joining the military. According to the U.S. Navy, more than 500 former Sea Cadets join the United States Navy in a typical year 10% to 12% of graduating Sea Cadets will enter each incoming U.S. Naval Academy Class.

Wilks becomes the first African American in the Coast Guard to reach the rank of Captain. He was also the first African American Coast Guard aviator and would later become the first African American to command a Coast Guard air station.

Sept 2, 1945 – Japan signs surrender documents on board USS *Missouri* (BB-63) in Tokyo Bay.

Sept 5, 1990 – USS *Acadia* (AD-42) departs San Diego for first war-time deployment of male-female crew on a combat vessel.

Sept 7, 1942 – First air evacuation of casualties to hospital ships off shore occurs at Guadalcanal.

Sept 9, 1945 – A "computer bug" is first identified and named by Lt. Grace Murray Hopper while she was on Navy active duty.

Sept 10, 1813 – In the Battle of Lake Erie, Commodore Oliver Hazard Perry, flying his "Don't give up the ship" flag, defeats British squadron and says: "We have met the enemy and they are ours..."

Sept 11, 2001 -American Flight 77 hijacked by terrorists struck the Pentagon. Casualties include 33 sailors, 6 Department of the Navy civilians, and 3 Navy Civilian contractors reported missing. Two commercial airliners also struck the World Trade Center in New York City, NY, destroying both towers. A fourth aircraft crashed around Shanksville, PA, when passengers on board tried to regain control of the aircraft from the terrorists.

Sept 13, 1847 – A Marine brigade leads U.S. forces that storm Chapultepec Castle near Mexico City, inspiring a line in the Marines' Hymn.

Sept 14, 1814 – British bombardment of Fort McHenry inspires Frances Scott Key to write the Star Spangled Banner.

Sept 16, 1854 – CDR David G. Farragut takes possession of Mare Island, the first U.S. Navy Yard on the Pacific coast.

Sept 18, 1990 – A new 40-acre training facility for Military Operations in Urban Terrain (MOUT) was dedicated at Camp Lejeune, NC, by General Alfred M. Gray, Commandant of the Marine Corps.

Sept 20, 1951 – In Operation Summit, the first combat helicopter landing in history, U.S. Marines were landed in Korea.

Sept 23, 1931 – Lt. Alfred Pride pilots Navy's first rotary wing aircraft in landings and takeoffs on board USS *Langley* while underway.

Sept 26, 1931 – Keel laying at Newport News, VA of USS *Ranger* (CV-4), first ship designed and constructed as an aircraft carrier.

Sept 27, 1942 – Douglas A. Munro Signalman 1/C, USCG gave his life evacuating Marines of the 1st Bn. 7th Marines, at Matanikau Point, Guadalcanal.

Sept 27, 1950 – First Marine Division Captures Seoul, South Korea.

Sept 30, 1954 – Commissioning at Groton, Ctr, of USS *Nautilus* (SSN-571), the worlds first nuclear-powered submarine.

Captain Kevin W. Ralston Commanding Officer USS SAN DIEGO (LPD 22)

CAPT Kevin Ralston is a native of Gardiner, Montana. He is a 1995 graduate of the University of Montana and was commissioned through Officer Candidate School in 1997.

CAPT Ralston's operational assignments include Division Officer tours as Electrical Officer and Auxiliaries Officer in USS LAKE CHAMPLAIN (CG 57) and as Officer-in-Charge of an 11 meter Rigid hull Inflatable Boat Detachment at Special Boat Team TWELVE (SBT 12). He served

consecutive Department Head tours as Operations Officer in USS SHOUP (DDG 86) and Commander, Destroyer Squadron TWENTY ONE (CDS 21). CAPT Ralston served as Executive Officer in the U.S. Seventh Fleet command ship, USS BLUE RIDGE (LCC 19). He commanded USS VANDEGRIFT (FFG 48) and USS MILWAUKEE (LCS 5).

Ashore, CAPT Ralston attended Naval Postgraduate School where he earned a Master of Business Administration; filled a Global War on Terrorism Support Assignment at U.S. European Command; served as an Action Officer and Deputy Branch Chief in the Global Operations Directorate, U. S. Strategic Command, Offutt Air Force Base, served as an Action Officer in OPNAV N51, was the Surface Placement Branch Head in PERS-41 at Navy Personnel Command and most recently served as Deputy Director of Current Operations at Commander, Naval Forces Europe/Africa and Commander U.S. Sixth Fleet.

His personal awards include the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal, Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal and various unit, campaign and service medals.

On September 8 and 9, the Honolulu Council is holding a virtual Indo-Pacific Maritime Security Exchange event, which is action packed. The speakers over the two days is impressive and are indeed experts from across the Pacific in regards to IUU fishing.
