ON THIS DATE IN...

November

1 Nov, 1949 – Authority to reestablish the Women's Reserve of the Coast Guard Reserves (SPARS) became effective.

Nov 5, 1775 - Commodore Esek Hopkins is appointed to the Commander in Chief of the Continental Navy.

Nov 5, 1945 - Ensign Jake C. West makes the first jet landing on board a carrier, USS *Wake Island* (CVE-65).

Nov 7 - Daylight Savings Time begin.

Fall back an hour.

Nov 9, 1921 – USS *Olympia* arrives at the Washington Navy Yard from France carrying the body of the Unknown Soldier for internment at Arlington National Cemetery.

Nov 10, 1775 – Congress votes to raise two battalions of Continental Marines, establishing the Marine Corps.

Nov 10 - HAPPY 246th BIRTHDAY UNITED STATES MARINE CORPS!!!

Nov 11, 1918 - Armistice ends World War I.

Nov 11, 1954 – This date is designated as Veterans Day to honor veterans of all U.S. wars. Hug a vet and say thanks.

Nov 12, 1912 – Lt Theodore Ellyson makes the first successful launching of an airplane by catapult at the Washington Navy Yard.

Nov 13, 1982 - The Vietnam Veterans Memorial, containing the names of more than 13,000 Marines who lost their lives in Vietnam, was dedicated at the Memorial site in Washington, DC.

Nov 16, 1942 – The Navy's first Nigh Fighter squadron (VMF)N)-531) is established at Cherry Point, NC.

Nov 17, 1924 – USS *Langley*, the first aircraft carrier, reports for duty.

Nov 24, 1992 – Marines lowered the flag at Subic Bay, U.S. Naval Facility, Republic of the Philippines, for the last time during ceremonies to turn over the facility to the government of the Philippines. This ended almost a century of U.S. presence in the nation.

Nov 25 - HAPPY THANKSGIVING!!!

Nov 25, 1961 – Commissioning of USS *Enterprise* (CVA(N)-65), the first nuclear powered aircraft carrier, at Newport News, VA.

Nov 28 - Hanukkah begins at sundown.

Commander James J. Light
Executive Officer, Fleet Logistics Support Squadron (VRC) 30

A native of Glenville, New York, Commander Light graduated from the United States Naval Academy in 2004 and Naval Postgraduate School in 2005, earning a Bachelor of Science with Honors in Economics and a Master of Science with Honors in Command and Control. CDR Light reported to NAS Pensacola, FL for flight training in September 2005. He earned his Naval



Aviator Wings in January 2008. In February 2008, CDR Light reported to the VAW 120 "Greyhawks" for initial fleet training as a C-2A Pilot.

CDR Light began his operational flying in March 2009 with the "Providers" of VRC 30. While a "Provider", he made deployments aboard USS NIMITZ (CVN 68), and USS JOHN C STENNIS (CVN 74) in support of Operations IRAQI FREEDOM and ENDURING FREEDOM.

CDR Light then reported to the "Greyhawks" of VAW 120 as a C-2A Instructor Pilot. He served as the C-2A Training Officer, C-2A Program Manager, and Assistant Safety Officer. During his tour, CDR Light was honored as COMACCLOWING C-2A Pilot of the Year-Shore in 2013. Additionally, he completed Joint Professional Military Education Phase I thru the Naval War College and was awarded the Vice Admiral John T Hayward Award for Outstanding Performance for Academic Year 2013-2014. CDR Light next reported to the USS DWIGHT D EISENHOWER (CVN-69) as a Catapult and Arresting Gear Officer in August 2014.

CDR Light returned to the fleet as a Department Head in VRC-40, the "Rawhides" in October 2015. He served as the Safety Officer, Maintenance Officer, Detachment Officer-in-Charge, and Operations Officer during his tour. He completed one deployment aboard USS GEORGE H W BUSH (CVN-77) with Detachment TWO supporting Operation INHERENT RESOLVE in 2017.

Following his department head tour, CDR Light served as a Team Chief and Branch Chief, US Africa Command, J-3 Directorate. While at AFRICOM, he directly supported planning, execution and reporting on multiple operations and activities in the AFRICOM Area of Operations. He was selected for squadron command in March 2020 and is scheduled to report to VRC-30 as Executive Officer in July 2021.

CDR Light has accumulated more than 2,700 flight hours and 200 carrier arrested landings in the C-2A including arrestments on all ten Nimitz class CVNs. His personal awards include the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (3), and Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal (2). CDR Light is married to Mrs. Alexis Light, a native of Lake Forest, California. They have four children: Jude (14), Luca (12), Hart (8) and Hyde (6).
