Helicopter Sea Combat Squadron THREE (HSC 3) Merlins is a Fleet Replacement Squadron providing training for Naval Aviators and Naval Aircrewmen in the MH-60S Sea Hawk helicopter for the Commander, Helicopter Sea Combat Wing, U.S. Pacific Fleet. HSC 3 (previously Helicopter Combat Support Squadron THREE) is a United States Navy multi-role combat helicopter squadron based at Naval Air Station North Island, San Diego,



California. The squadron was established on 1 September 1967 at Naval Air Station Imperial Beach with the Boeing Vertol CH-46 Sea Knight to provide vertical replenishment on the West Coast, and was redesignated HSC 3 on 1 April 2005. HSC 3 produces the finest fleet replacement pilots and aircrewmen in the world, ready to fly into harm's ways in support of our nation's interests.

Captain Thomas Butts is a native of Erlanger, KY. He enlisted in the Navy in 1995 as a Radioman and was later selected for the Enlisted Commissioning Program. He graduated from the University of North Florida in 2002 and was designated a Naval Aviator in December 2004. After receiving his "Wings of Gold" he reported to the "Merlins" of HSC-3 for initial training in the MH-60S Knighthawk.

CAPT Butts has completed operational flying tours with the "Island Knights" of HSC-25 (Junior Officer) and the "Sea Knights" of HSC-22 (Department Head). He served his disassociated tour as the Air Boss on USS SAN ANTONIO (LPD-17).

His shore assignments include two Fleet Replacement Squadron flight instructor tours with the "Fleet Angels" of HSC-2 as well as a joint tour assignment on the Joint Staff in the J-7 Directorate where he worked in the Joint Exercise Division

directly supporting the Chairman's Exercise Program and United States Transportation Command. Post O5 command he was assigned to the OPNAV N98 Staff where he served as the MH-60S Requirements Officer.

He is a graduate of the Naval Postgraduate School's Executive MBA program, completed JPME Phase I through the Air Force Air Command and Staff College and in residence JPME Phase II at the Joint Forces Staff College.

In command at sea, he led the 2021 Battle "E" award winning HSC-25 "Island Knights" and the HSC-7 "Dusty Dogs".

CAPT Butts has accumulated 2,600 flight hours and was awarded the 2015 Navy and Marine Corps Leadership Award. His other awards include the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (2 awards), Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (8 awards), Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal (5 awards) and various personal, unit and campaign awards.

BREAKFAST SPONSOR IN THE SPOTLIGHT

Navy Federal was originally incorporated on 17 January 1933 as the Navy Department Employees' Credit Union of the District of Columbia. Only Navy Department employees who were members of the federal employees' labor union and members of their families were eligible to join. The next year, President Roosevelt signed into law the Federal Credit Union Act., which would eventually become the basis of business for the credit union. On July 17, 1947, the credit union was granted a federal charter as a credit union, named Navy Department Employees Federal Credit Union. It also expanded membership to include all Navy personnel in the Washington, D.C., area, both military and civilian.



In May 2008, Navy Federal Credit Union (NFCU) widened its membership to include the entire Department of Defense (DoD), which made eligible all active duty, retired, and reserve Army, Navy, Marine Corps and Air Force personnel, as well as contractor and civilian personnel within the DoD. In March 2013, NFCU further widened its membership to include all Coast Guard members and employees and Space Force members in 2020.

Since 1933, NFCU has grown from 7 members to over 13.5 million members and \$171B in assets as of January 2024, holding distinction as the world's largest credit union since April 1962. NFCU is an American global credit union headquartered in Vienna, Virginia, charted and regulated under the authority of the National Credit Union Administration, where NFCU puts its members financial needs first with low fees, great rates and discounts at any of the 355 branches, many located near military bases. NFCU is proud to be a member-owned, not for profit credit union supporting all branches of the military, DoD, veterans, and their families through every stage of life. The San Diego Council is honored to have NFCU as a community partner.
