

# **NAVY HERITAGE**

United States Ships named in honor of United States of America and its Independence. On July 4, 1776, the 13 colonies claimed their independence from England, which led to the formation of the United States of America. Its first six frigates where named; United States, Constellation, Constitution, Chesapeake, Congress, and President. Independence would take its namesake place aboard six different classes of ships; Sloop of War, Ship of the Line, Steamer, Light Aircraft Carrier (CVL 22), Aircraft Carrier (CV 62) and Littoral Combat Ship (LCS 2) that was decommissioned in 2021. Today, USS Constitution, (aka Old Ironsides) is one of the six original



frigates still serving in the U.S. Navy and the world's oldest ship, homeported in Newport, RI. USS Constellation (FFG 62) will be the lead ship of its Guided Missile Class Frigate and the fifth ship to bear the namesake scheduled to be commissioned in 2027. However, nothing compares to the namesake - AMERICA. There has been five different ships that have bear the name; Ship of the Line, a Racing Yacht during the Civil War, an Ocean Liner, Troop Transport and an Aircraft Carrier (CV 66) from 1965 to 1996, The Aircraft Carrier America was the only supercarrier to be used as a target for training and the largest warship to ever to be sunk. Today AMERICA's name lives on; USS AMERICA (LHA 6), the first of its amphibious assault class ships, commissioned in 2014. Her mission is to act as the flagship of an Expeditionary Strike Group, carrying part of a Marine expeditionary unit into battle and putting them ashore with helicopters and V-22 Osprey tilt-rotor aircraft, supported by F-35B Lightning II aircraft and helicopters. AMERICA's original homeport was San Diego, California, until it changed to Sasebo, Japan in 2019. AMERICA is scheduled to return to San Diego homeport in late 2024.

Lieutenant Colonel Gonzalez is a native of Las Vegas, Nevada. He enlisted in the Marine Corps in 1997 and served as a Navigational Aids Technician with Marine Wing Support Squadron 374 and Marine Air Control Squadron 1 (MACS-1). In 2003, he was accepted to the Marine Enlisted Commissioning Education Program and attended California State University San Marcos while attached to Naval Reserve Training Officer Corps San Diego.

After completing The Basic School and Air Defense Control Officer Course, Second Lieutenant Gonzalez reported to MACS-1 in 2007. He served as the Operations Section Officer in Charge (OIC) and Executive Officer (XO) of the Early Warning and Control Detachment. In 2010, First Lieutenant Gonzalez deployed in support of Operation Enduring Freedom while serving as Crew OIC and Senior Traffic Director of the Tactical Air Operations Center (TAOC).

From 2011-2012, Captain Gonzalez attended Expeditionary Warfare School in residence and the Weapons and Tactics Instructor Course. He was subsequently transferred to Marine Tactical Air Command Squadron 18 in Okinawa, Japan. In 2013, Captain Gonzalez was reassigned to MACS-4, where he served as the TAOC Detachment Commander for two years.

Following his tour in Japan, Captain Gonzalez reported to Marine Corps Embassy Security Group, Region 8, in Frankfurt, Germany. There he served as an Inspecting Officer and Region XO, providing oversight and support to 19 consulates and embassies throughout Central Europe and the Balkan Peninsula.

From 2017-2020, Major Gonzalez returned to MACS-4, where he served as the squadron Operations Officer and XO. In the summer of 2020, Major Gonzalez was transferred to Headquarters Marine Corps, Department of Aviation. While at Aviation, he served as an Air Defense Officer in the Aviation Expeditionary Enablers branch and the Cunningham Group. Lieutenant Colonel Gonzalez was promoted to his current rank in October 2022 and took command of 3d LAAD Bn on 7 July 2023.

His personal decorations include the Meritorious Service Medal (with a gold star in lieu of 2nd award), the Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (with a gold star in lieu of 2nd award), and the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal (w/two gold stars in lieu of 3rd award)

He is married with three children.
