NAVY HERITAGE

On Sunday Morning December 7, 1941, the Imperial Japanese Navy attacked U.S. Navy Base in Pearl Harbor killing 2,403 Americans. The raid by aircraft carrier-borne warplanes sunk or damaged 21 U.S. warships — including the USS Arizona and USS Oklahoma, destroyed or damaged 347 aircraft. and Nazi Germany had conquered much of Asia. Europe and North Africa by the end of 1941. The shape of the future world began to turn in the midst of the attack on Pearl Harbor, where America overcame the shock of sudden attack and began to fight back. Fifteen Sailors and one Marine earned the Medal of Honor for heroic actions that day alone. Among them were Rear Admiral Isaac Kidd, who died commanding the defense from the bridge of USS Arizona, the first U.S. flag officer killed in any war; Captain Mervyn Bennion, who remained in command of USS West Virginia, saving the ship despite mortal wounds; and Chief Boatswain Edwin Hill, whose remarkable heroics freed the USS Nevada while under attack. USS Nevada was the only battleship to set sail that morning. She went on to distinguished service in the war and helped lead the D-Day invasion of Europe in 1944 and the final attacks on the Japanese home islands in the summer of 1945. USS West Virginia also survived the Pearl Harbor attack, but at the loss of 106 Sailors, and was able to triumphantly sail into Tokyo Bay to witness the surrender of Japan and the end of World War II aboard USS Missouri as Japan formally signed documents of surrender on September 2, 1945, with the ceremony lasting only 23 minutes. Yet it ended more than a total decade of devastating global conflict that killed 60 million people or more in Asia, Europe and Africa, and in other battles fought on land, air and sea around the world. "Today, the guns are silent. A great tragedy has ended. A great victory has been won," U.S. Gen. Douglas MacArthur said in an international radio address while officiating during the ceremonies aboard USS Missouri. Today, USS Missouri still serves the country in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, where she is the centerpiece of the Battleship Missouri Memorial.



BREAKFAST SPEAKER

CAPT Ladislao R. Montero is a native of Nogales AZ. He enlisted in the Navy in 1988 and served over 5 years as an avionics technician. He completed his active service then utilized his GI bill benefits to graduate from the University of Arizona with a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science in 1998. He also received a Master of Arts in National Security and Strategic Studies from the U.S. Naval War College in 2010

Designated a Naval Flight Officer in April 2001, CAPT Montero completed seven operational carrier deployments flying the S-3B Viking, EA-6B Prowler and EA-18G Growler. During his first tour with the "Redtails" of VS-21 where he flew the S-3B, he deployed onboard the USS Kitty Hawk (CV 63) forward deployed in Atsugi, Japan completing two Western Pacific and one Arabian gulf deployments.

Following his overseas tour, he transferred to Naval Air Station Whidbey Island to transition to the might EA-6B. Assigned to the "Patriots" of VAQ-140, he deployed onboard the USS Eisenhower (CVN 69) for an eight-month combat deployment.

Upon completing his second operational tour, CAPT Montero was selected as an Individual Augmentee and deployed with the U.S. Army 10th Mountain Division as an Electronic Warfare Officer working in the Counter-Improvised Explosive Device (C-IED) defeat cell. His ten months "boots on the ground" were CAPT Montero's third tour in Iraq.

Following his third combat deployment, CAPT Montero attended the Naval War College prior to his selection as department head. For his department head tour, he served as Safety Officer, Administrative Officer and Maintenance Officer, completing a deployment onboard the USS George Washington (CVN 73) with the "The Gauntlets"" of VAQ-136 and the transition to the EA-18G Growler. On his most recent operational deployment as the Commanding Officer of the "Cougars" of VAQ-139, CAPT Montero led his squadron to his fourth combat deployment onboard the USS Theodore Roosevelt (CVN 71) to the Indo-Pacific and Arabian gulf area of responsibility.

CAPT Montero's shore tours include Fighter Intercept Control Officer at NATO Combined Air Operations Center Torrejón de Ardoz in Madrid Spain and most recently served as the Military Deputy to the Electronic Warfare Director, Office of the Undersecretary of Defense for Acquisition and Sustainment, Platform and Weapons Portfolio Management, Electronic Warfare in The Pentagon, Washington, D.C.

His accomplishments include recognition as Commander, Electronic Attack Wing, Pacific, Junior Officer "Seadog Fodor" leadership award for 2007. Additionally, during this CO and XO tour, the "Cougars" of VAQ-139 were the recipients of the 2016, 2017, and 2018 Battle Efficiency Award.

CAPT Montero has accumulated over 2,600 total hours flying the S-3B, EA-6B and EA-18G in support of Operations Southern Watch, Enduring Freedom, Iragi Freedom, Inherent Resolve and Enduring Sentinel. He has totaled over 600 arrested landings on six different aircraft carriers and has received multiple individual and campaign awards including the Bronze Star, Defense Meritorious Service Medal (2 awards), Meritorious Service Medal, and Strike/Flight Air Medal (4 awards).
