NAVY HERITAGE

Amphibious Squadron FIVE is a tactical and administrative organization composed of amphibious assault shipping to transport troops and their equipment for an amphibious assault operation. Before the advent of modern helicopter-oriented amphibious warfare, the amphibious squadron was made up differently, depending on the era. During the 1960s, a typical squadron might consist of an Attack Transport (APA/ a Dock Landing Ship (LSD), an Attack Cargo Ship (AKA/LKA), one or two Landing Ships Tank (LST) and, especially if there were only one LST, a High Speed Transport (APD). The APA carried troops and Landing Craft Vehicle Personnel (LCVP)s in which to land them, plus a few Landing Craft Mechanized (LCM)s for bigger loads. The AKA carried cargo and an assortment of LCVPs and LCMs with which to land it. The LSD carried boats. The LST carried tanks and other rolling stock, and had the ability to discharge its cargo directly onto the beach. The destroyer-like APD provided limited gunfire support and fast defense of the squadron. It frequently also carried a UDT unit or other similar troops. The Landing Platform Helicopter (LPH) replaced the APA in the late 1960s and provided helicopters to land troops and supplies inland, beyond the beach. In modern times, a U.S. PHIBRON usually consists of three amphibious ships, typically one Landing Helicopter Deck (LHD), a Dock Landing Ship (LSD) and an Amphibious Transport Dock (LPD). When the ships of a PHIBRON are loaded up with the forces of a Marine Expeditionary Unit and some additional Navy units (including a Tactical Air Control Squadron (TACRON) detachment and landing craft from two or more Assault Craft Units or ACU), it is designated as an Amphibious Ready Group (ARG). The officer in charge of a PHIBRON is designated COMPHIBRON or Commander Amphibious Squadron and acts as the commodore for all ships in the ARG.

BREAKFAST SPEAKER

CAPT Kim is a native of Los Angeles, California and was commissioned in 1996 from UCLA NROTC program with a Bachelor's Degree in International Relations. Specializing in East Asia, he gained fluency in Korean and Japanese.

His first assignment was onboard USS PORT ROYAL (CG 73), taking part in one of the Navy's first Ballistic Missile Defense capability upgrades and conducting Maritime Interdiction Operations in the Arabian Gulf. He next served onboard USS KITTY HAWK (CV 63), enforcing the No Fly Zone and supporting UN Sanctions against the Saddam regime. He was then selected as Flag Aide to Commander, Logistics Group Western Pacific, assisting in six bi-lateral naval exercises with Southeast Asian nations. CAPT Kim was then accepted into the Naval Postgraduate School (NPS) where he earned a dual Master's degree in Operations Research from NPS and a Master's Degree in Defense Systems & Technology from the National University of Singapore.



CAPT Kim returned to sea as Chief Engineer onboard USS VANDEGRIFT (FFG 48), forward deployed to SEVENTH Fleet participating in regional maritime defense operations with the Korean & Japanese navies. He was then assigned as Executive Officer of MCM CREW CONSTANT, completing two deployments to the Arabian Gulf and supporting Operations Iraqi Freedom and Enduring Freedom. His follow-on assignment was to the staff of the Commander, Naval Forces Central Command and FIFTH Fleet as part of the Theater Security Cooperation effort coordinating anti-piracy operations with over 20 nations to include Pakistan, India, China, and Russia.

CAPT Kim was next assigned to Commander, U.S. Forces Central Command (CENTCOM) as part of the J8 Resources & Analysis Branch before being selected as the Assistant Executive Officer for the Deputy Commander supporting antiterrorism efforts in Iran, Afghanistan, and Yemen as well as anti-piracy efforts in the Horn of Africa.

CAPT Kim then served as Commanding Officer of USS FORT WORTH (LCS 3) where he hosted the Chief of Naval Operations of the Peoples Liberation Army Navy, ADM Wu Sheng Li, and developed tactics for the Surface Warfare Mission Module. He then became the first N8/9 Branch Head for the Naval Surface & Mine Warfighting Development Center, or SWO "Top Gun," responsible for all Surface Warfare Tactics and Doctrine development. He then went to serve as the Chief of Staff for US Naval Forces Korea, overseeing the first co-location of US and ROK Naval Headquarters in Busan, South Korea. CAPT Kim was then selected for the Federal Executive Fellowship at the Harvard Kennedy School in Cambridge, MA where he focused on Great Power Competition.

He then went to serve as Commander, LCS Mine Division TWELVE, overseeing 4 LCSs, 3 MCMs, and the development of the first fully autonomous mine warfare system. He continued to Commander, Amphibious Squadron THREE, in charge of the USS MAKIN ISLAND & USS TRIPOLI Amphibious Ready Groups as well as Mission Commander for PACIFIC PARTNERSHIP 22, the largest HADR mission in INDO-PACOM. CAPT Kim then served as the Executive Assistant and Acting Deputy to Director, Expeditionary Warfare (OPNAV N95) at OPNAV N95.

He is currently the Prospective Commodore for Amphibious Squadron FIVE.

His military decorations include the Legion of Merit, Defense and Navy Meritorious Service Medals, Navy and Marine Corps Commendation and Achievement Medals, and the Joint Service Achievement Medal.

It was formed by the merger of Lockheed Corporation with Martin Marietta in March 1995. It is headquartered in North Bethesda, Maryland, in the Washington, D.C. area. Lockheed Martin employs approximately 115,000 employees worldwide, including about 60,000 engineers and scientists as of January 2022. Lockheed Martin is one of the largest companies in the aerospace, military support, security, and technologies industry. It is the world's largest defense contractor by revenue for fiscal year 2014. In 2013, 78% of Lockheed Martin's revenues came from military sales; it topped the list of US federal government contractors and received nearly 10% of the funds paid out by the Pentagon. In 2009, US government contracts accounted for \$38.4 billion (85%), foreign government contracts for \$5.8 billion (13%), and commercial and other contracts for \$900 million (2%). Half of the corporation's annual sales are to the U.S. Department of Defense. Lockheed Martin is also a contractor for the Department of Energy and NASA. Lockheed Martin operates in four business segments: Aeronautics, Missiles and Fire Control, Rotary and Mission Systems, and Space. The company has received the Collier Trophy Award six times, including in 2001 for being part of developing the X-35/F-35B LiftFan Propulsion System and most recently in 2018 for the Automatic Ground Collision Avoidance System. Lockheed Martin leads the development for the F-35 Lightning II and leads the international supply chain and for the implementation of technology solutions for the new USAF Space Fence, and the Orion command module. The company also invests in healthcare systems, renewable energy systems, intelligent energy distribution, and compact nuclear fusion. Lockheed Martin has a long history as a San Diego Council Community Partner in supporting it's Maritime Forces and their families in the community
