

United States Ships named in honor of United States of America and its Independence. On July 4, 1776, the 13 colonies claimed their independence from England, which led to the formation of the United States of America. Its first six frigates where named; United States, Constellation, Constitution, Chesapeake, Congress, and President. Independence would take its namesake place aboard six different classes of ships; Sloop of War, Ship of the Line, Steamer, Light Aircraft Carrier (CVL 22), Aircraft Carrier (CV 62) and Littoral



the Line, Steamer, Light Aircraft Carrier (CVL 22), Aircraft Carrier (CV 62) and Littoral Combat Ship (LCS 2) that was decommissioned in 2021. Today, USS Constitution, (aka Old Ironsides) is one of the six original frigates still serving in the U.S. Navy and the world's oldest ship, homeported in Newport, RI. USS Constellation (FFG 62) will be the lead ship of its Guided Missile Class Frigate and the fifth ship to bear the namesake scheduled to be commissioned in 2027. However, nothing compares to the namesake - AMERICA. There has been five different ships that have bear the name; Ship of the Line, a Racing Yacht during the Civil War, an Ocean Liner, Troop Transport and an Aircraft Carrier (CV 66) from 1965 to 1996, The Aircraft Carrier America was the only supercarrier to be used as a target for training and the largest warship to ever to be sunk. Today AMERICA's name lives on; USS AMERICA (LHA 6), the first of its amphibious assault class ships, commissioned in 2014. Her mission is to act as the flagship of an Expeditionary Strike Group, carrying part of a Marine Expeditionary Unit into battle and putting the ashore with helicopters and V-22 Osprey tilt-rotor aircraft, supported by F-35B Lightning II aircraft and helicopters. AMERICA's original homeport was San Diego, California, until it changed to Sasebo, Japan in 2019. AMERICA is scheduled to return to San Diego homeport this year in 2025.

Vice Adm. John F. G. Wade is a native of Port Washington, New York. He is a 1990 graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy with a bachelor's degree in Economics. He also holds a master's degree in Information Systems Technology from the U.S. Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey, California, and a master's degree in National Security Strategy from the National War College in Washington, District of Columbia.

A career Surface Warfare Officer, Wade has served at sea on Patrol Craft, Destroyers, Cruisers and Aircraft

Carriers, completing multiple deployments and overseas contingency operations to include Desert Storm, Southern Watch, Noble Eagle, Enduring Freedom and Iragi Freedom, He commanded USS Firebolt (PC 10), USS Preble (DDG 88), Destrover Squadron 28, and Carrier Strike Group 12 embarked aboard USS Abraham Lincoln (CVN 72).

Ashore, Wade served on the personal staff of the Chief of Naval Operations; executive assistant to the director of the Quadrennial Defense Review Team; deputy executive assistant to the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff; chief of staff to Commander, Naval Surface Force, U.S. Pacific Fleet; director of maritime operations, U.S. Fleet Forces Command; and, director of operations, U.S. Indo-Pacific Command. He served with the Army's 10th Mountain and 82nd Airborne Divisions as commanding officer of the Joint/Interagency Provincial Reconstruction Team (PRT) - Khost, Afghanistan. Additionally, he commanded the Naval Surface and Mine Warfighting Development Center. Most recently, he commanded Joint Task Force - Red Hill which was established to safely and expeditiously defuel the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility in Oahu, Hawaii.

Wade assumed duties as commander, THIRD Fleet in June 2024.

Wade's personal decorations include the Defense Distinguished Service Medal, Defense Superior Service Medal, Legion of Merit, Bronze Star, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, the Army Combat Action Badge, and various service, campaign and unit awards. He is also the recipient of the Vice Adm. E.C. Waller and Vice Adm. John D. Bulkeley leadership awards.

BREAKFAST SPONSOR IN THE SPOTLIGHT

The Navy League Foundation offers scholarships to high school seniors who are dependent or direct descendants of current or former members of the U.S. Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, or Merchant Marine, or who are active members of the Naval Sea Cadet Corps. Scholarships are also available to spouses of active duty, retired, or deceased service members in the Navy, Marine Corps, or Coast Guard. The application process involves submitting an application form, personal statement, official transcript, and recommendation letters. Eligibility Requirements includes; U.S. Citizen, GPA of 3.0 or higher. and Acceptance to College of an accredited institution of higher education. The San Diego Council is Sponsored by; Alexander Kreiglowa Scholarship namesake is from Norwich, CT, where he enlisted in the U.S. Navy at the age of 16 years old. Alex served over 20 years of honorable service, with 17 years at sea aboard 10 different warships. While ashore he trained young recruits at the Naval Training Center San Diego for over 3 years. During his shore tour, he said this assignment required long hours, but was the most satisfying. Chief Kreiglowa retired in 1957, whereas it was the highest enlisted rank in the U.S. Navy at that time. He touched so many lives of young men, and is continuing that legacy through

his Scholarship Program. Upon establishing this scholarship; "I always worked hard to get ahead and now I want to give something back to the Navy and my country. The Navy was very good to me and I think this is one way I can give back. I want this scholarship money to go to students who have a strong desire to get ahead and accomplish things." Chief Kreiglowa passed away on March 21, 2018 at the age of 100, but his generosity lives on through the Navy League Foundation and the San Diego Council.
