NAVY HERITAGE

Marines across the globe will recognize and acknowledge 250 years of service to their country, the sacrifices made to defend democracy, and the Marine Corps' enduring legacy as America's premier fighting force. The Marines are responsible for conducting expeditionary and amphibious operations with the United States Navy as well as the Army and Air Force. The Marine Corps annual tradition celebrates the establishment of the organization on November 10, 1775, by the Second



Continental Congress. Following their role in the American Revolution, the Marines were abolished following the Treaty of Paris in April 1783. Then, on July 11, 1798, Congress ordered the creation of the Marine Corps signed by President John Adams and directed that it be available for service under the Secretary of the Navy. The birthday, also known as Marine Corps Day, was originally celebrated on July 11 from 1799 until 1921 when Major General Lejeune issued an order Number 47 to formalize the tradition and establish the official day to its orginal birthdate on November 10th to honor the birthday of the Marine Corps. The ceremony traditionally includes a guest of honor, a reading of Gen. Lejeune's birthday message and the current Commandant's message, recognition of the oldest and youngest Marine present, and a cake cutting ceremony. While the first cake ceremony is unknown, the first on record took place at Marine Barracks, Washington, D.C., in 1937. Major General Thomas Holcomb, the Commandant, presided at an open house for Marine Corps officers, including the cutting of a huge cake in the shape of Tun Tavern, the birthplace of the Marine Corps. Today the Marine Corps Birthday celebration has expanded by various organizations in the community in celebrating and recognizing Marines and its birthday through many special events, exhibits and parades, such as ours on November 7th, but on November 10th, regardless of where Marines are stationed, or deployed, whether they are still on Active Duty, Reserve, Veterans or Retired, you will always hear "Happy Birthday, Marine."



LtCol Mark W. Bock Jr. was born in State College, PA, and raised in VA by his parents Mary Bock and CAPT Mark Bock Sr., USN (Ret).

He graduated from Christopher Newport University in Newport News, VA, in 2008, earning a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration and completed the Officer Candidates School Platoon Leaders Class and received a commission as a 2nd LT in May 2008.





Lt Col Bock completed advanced aviation training at VT-31 at NAS Corpus Christi, where he earned his Naval Aviator wings on the Commodore's List with Distinction on 11 Feb 2011. He reported to the KC-130J Aviation Training Unit at MCAS Miramar to earn designation as a KC-130J pilot and was subsequently assigned to VMGR-352, the Raiders. As a Raider, from Aug 2011 through Jun 2014, he executed two combat deployments in support of Operation ENDURING FREEDOM, flying both assault support missions and close air support missions as a Harvest HAWK pilot and fire control operator. LtCol Bock also flew humanitarian aid missions in the Philippines as part of Operation Damayan and attended the Aviation Safety Officer Course in NAS Pensacola. His billets included adjutant, detachment director of safety and standardization, and aviation safety officer.

His follow on assignments include; KC-130J Fleet Replacement Detachment at MCAS Cherry Point, Marine Aviation Weapons and Tactics Squadron One at MCAS Yuma. In 2021, he was selected by the Commandant's Professional Intermediate-Level Education Board to attend Command and Staff College at MCB Quantico, where he was a distinguished graduate and a Gray Scholar. In Jul 2022, he reported to VMGR-352 where he served as the Aircraft Maintenance Officer (AMO) and Executive Officer. As AMO, he led the effort to configure three special mission aircraft for the first service-supported transpacific air-to-air refueling mission of USMC fighter aircraft in 40 years. In Nov 2023 LtCol Bock was assigned to the MAG-11 Headquarters staff to prepare for command assignment.

LtCol Bock's personal awards include Air Medal with eleven Strike Flight Awards, three Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medals, and the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal. Lieutenant Colonel Bock holds a Master of Science in economics from Purdue University and a Master of Military Studies from Marine Corps University
